

 Whereas Seymour J. Waldron of Buffalo County Nebraska has
 deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of
 the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment
 has been made by the said Seymour J. Waldron according to the provisions of the
 Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1828 entitled "An Act making further provision
 for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the east half of
 the North West Quarter and the lot numbered three of section eight in Township eight
 North of Range fifteen west in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island
 Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty five acres and sixty hundredths of an acre
 according to the official plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General
 Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the
 said Seymour J. Waldron

Now Know Ye That the United States of America in consideration of the
 premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made
 and provided have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto
 the said Seymour J. Waldron and to his heirs the said tract above described to
 have and to hold the same together with all the rights privileges immunities
 and appurtenances of whatever nature thereunto belonging unto the said
 Seymour J. Waldron and to his heirs and assigns forever

In testimony whereof I Rutherford B. Hayes President of the United
 States of America have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal of the
 General Land Office to be hereunto affixed

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the twentyfirst day of
 July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventynine
 and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourth
