To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
Certificate No. 5841.

Whereas Robert J. Wallace of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that Full Payment has been made by the said Robert J. Wallace according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands"; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the West half of the North East quarter and the East half of the Northwest Quarter of Section Twenty-six in Township eleven North of Range Seventeen West of the Sixth principal meridian in Nebraska, containing One Hundred and Sixty acres, according to the official Plot of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Robert J. Wallace

Now, know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made, ^{and} provided, Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and grant unto the said Robert J. Wallace and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said Robert J. Wallace and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the third day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Ninety one and of the Independence of the United States the One hundred and sixteenth.
