has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certifi-
cate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska
wherby it appears that full Payment has been made by the said Jacob
X. Weaver according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th
of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of
the Public Lands" and the acts Supplemental thereto for the South West
quarter of Section thre in Township eight north of range thirten west
of the Sixth Principal Meridian containing one hundred & sixty acrs-
according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the lands returned to the
General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has
been purchased by the said Jacob X. Weaver.

Now know ye, that the United States of America in consider-
ation of the promises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress
in such case made and provided. Have given and granted and by these
presents do give and grant unto the said Jacob X. Weaver and to his heirs the
said tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all
the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances of what so ever nature
therunto belonging unto the said Jacob X. Weaver and to his heirs and
assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof J. Charles A. Arthur, President of the
United States of America has caused these letters to be made Patent
and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the tenth day of
April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty
two and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and
sixth.
