To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office
of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at
Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant
to the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874
and June 14, 1878 "to encourage the growth of timber on the
Western prairies" the claim of Ada A. Webb formerly Ada A.
Crawr has been established and duly consummated in con-
formity to law for the North half of the South West quarter of
Section Thirty four in Township nine North of Range Seventeen
West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing
Eighty acres according to the Official Plot of the Survey of the said
Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General;

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States
unto the said Ada A. Webb the tract of Land above described
to have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances
thereof unto the said Ada A. Webb and to her heirs and assigns
forever.

the United States of America have caused these letters to be made
Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
affixed.
