 Do all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting,
 Certificate, Whereas, George Whistler, of Buffalo County,
 No. 3190 } Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office
 of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land
 Office, at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that
 full payment has been made by the said George Whistler
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of
 April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision
 for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental
 thereto, for the North half of the South East quarter, and the
 South East quarter of the South East quarter, of section
 twelve, and the North East quarter of the North East quarter,
 of section thirteen, in township twelve North, of Range
 seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in
 Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres,
 according to the official plat of the survey of the said
 lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General, which said tract has been purchased by the
 said George Whistler.

Now, know Ye, That the United States of America,
 in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given
 and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the
 said George Whistler and to his heirs, the said tract above described,
 To have and to hold, the same together with all the rights, privileges,
 immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature,
 thereunto belonging, unto the said George Whistler, and to
 his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, Benjamin Harrison, President of
 the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made
 Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hands, at the City of Washington, the fifth
 day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and eighty nine, and of the Independence of the United States the
 one hundred and fourteenth.
