

- 3. That said deceased left her surviving as her sole and only heirs at law, Lillian Clark and Mary C. Clark, her daughters, and Frank K. Clark, her son, all of full legal age, and that said deceased left no husband her surviving.
- 4. That subsequent to the death of said deceased, the petitioner, Winfred Hughes, became the owner of said real estate through mesne conveyances from the heirs at law of said deceased, and is now the owner thereof.
- 5. That there are no creditors of said estate.
- 6. That more than two years have elapsed since the death of said deceased.
- 7. That said estate is not liable for the payment of inheritance taxes.
- 8. That the regular administration be dispensed with.
