Certificate No. 294. } To all to whom these presents shall come: Knowing
 Whereas Goodlow Wilson of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited
 in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the
 register of the land office of said Nebraska whereby it appears
 that full payment has been made by the said Goodlow Wilson
 according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21st of
 April 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale
 of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the
 Lots numbered five and six of Section eleven and the North West
 quarter of the North West quarter and the Lot numbered four
 of Section fourteen in Township eight North of Range fifteen
 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one
 hundred and six and one fourth acres and forty hundredths of an acre according
 to the Official Plat of the Survey of said lands returned to the
 General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said
 Tract has been purchased by the said Goodlow Wilson. Now
 know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the
 promises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in
 such case made and provided Have given and granted and by these presents
 do give and grant unto the said Goodlow Wilson and to his heirs the said
 Tract above described to have and to hold the same together with all the
 rights privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever
 nature thereunto belonging unto the said Goodlow Wilson and
 to his heirs and assigns forever.

 Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
