Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of William Catterlin has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North west-quarter of the South East-quarter and the Lots number five ten and Eleven of section twenty seven in Township nine North of Range thirteen west of the sixth principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and forty five acres and thirty hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Wm Catterlin the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William Catterlin and to his heirs and assigns forever.
