To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:  
Certificate No. 1632. } Whereas Orson Wood of Buffalo County,  
Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United  
States a certificate of the Register of the Land office at Grand Island  
Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made  
by the said Orson Wood according to the provisions of the Act of Congress  
of the 24th, of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision  
for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto,  
for the north half of the north east Quarter, or the lots numbered one  
and two of Section six in Township eleven, north of Range sixteen,  
west of the sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing  
eighty six acres <sup>two</sup> twenty four hundredths of an acre, according to the  
official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the  
General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said  
tract has been purchased by the said Orson Wood. Now know  
ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the  
premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress  
in such case made <sup>and</sup> provided, have given and granted, and  
by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Orson Wood  
and to his heirs, the said tract above described; To have and to  
hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immuni-  
ties, <sup>and</sup> appurtenances of whatsoever nature, therein to belonging  
unto the said Orson Wood and to his heirs <sup>and</sup> assign forever.  
In Testimony Whereof, I Chester A. Arthur, President of the  
United States of America, have caused these letters to be made  
Patent, <sup>and</sup> the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.  
Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the eleventh  
day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and eighty four, and of the Independence of the  
United States the one hundred <sup>and</sup> seventh.
