Moved by Lynch and seconded by Morrow to accept the Clerk of District Court October 2023 Fee Report. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Lynch, Morrow, Higgins, Kouba, Loeffelholz, Maendele and Klein. Motion declared carried. Deputy County Attorney Andrew Hoffmeister arrived at 9:04 A.M.

Buffalo County Sheriff Neil Miller was present for the following agenda items. Lieutenant Rob Tubbs demonstrated the prepared live software available to 911 operators and callers. After discussion it was moved by Maendele and seconded by Lynch to accept South Central/Panhandle Nebraska 911 Regional Interlocal Agreement and authorize Chairperson Klein to sign the Interlocal Agreement. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Maendele, Lynch, Higgins, Kouba, Loeffelholz, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Loeffelholz to authorize Buffalo County Sheriff Neil Miller to sign the public safety software purchase – CentralSquare Technologies. Zoning Administrator Dennise Daniels and Deputy County Attorney Hoffmeister were present for the following Zoning agenda items.

Chairperson Klein opened a public hearing at 9:28 A.M. for a Special Use Permit application filed by Mark Morten, to operate a commercial dog business performing training, breeding, and limited small scale boarding services, for tax parcel 380081010, located at 29235 145th Road, Kearney, Nebraska, and described as Part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, situated in Section Twenty-five (25), Township Ten (10) North, Range Sixteen (16) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska. Jessica Morten and Attorney Nick Ridgeway of Jacobsen Orr Law Firm were present to answer questions. Cory Morten of Kearney, NE and Brent Carmody of Kearney, NE spoke in favor, no one else addressed the Board and Chairperson Klein closed the hearing at 9:49 A.M. Highway Superintendent John Maul was present for the following agenda items.

Chairperson Klein instructed County Clerk Christensen to open and read aloud the submitted bids for Project No. C10 (1007) Daykin Road starting at 325th Road and going north for two miles and C10 (1012) Coal Chute Road from Keystone Road to Lowell Road. Bids were submitted from the following companies: Morten Construction LLC, Van Kirk Bros. Contracting, Myers Construction Inc., and Adams Construction Co. Highway Superintendent Maul and the Road Committee will review the bids and come back with recommendations at the next meeting on November 28, 2023.

SIGNING OF THE YEAR-END CERTIFICATION OF COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT FORM 2023

Whereas: State of Nebraska Statues, sections 39-2302, and 39-2501 through 39-2505 detail the requirements that must be met in order for a county to qualify for an annual Incentive Payment; and

Whereas: The State of Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) requires that each county must annually certify (by December 31st of each year) the appointment(s) of the County Highway Superintendent(s) to the NDOT using the Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form; and

Whereas: The NDOT requires that such certification shall also include a copy of the documentation of the county highway superintendent's appointment, i.e., meeting minutes showing the appointment of the County Highway Superintendent by their name as it appears on their License (if applicable), their License Number (if applicable) and Class of License (if applicable), the type of appointment, i.e., employed or under contract (consultant, or interlocal agreement with another county and/or incorporated municipality), and the beginning date of the appointment; and

Whereas: The NDOT also requires that such Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form shall be signed by the County Board Chairperson and shall include a copy of a resolution of the County Board authorizing the signing of the Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form by the County Board Chairperson.
