WHEREAS, on May 10, 2021, the United State Department of Treasury released an interim final guide on allowed uses of funds and allocated \$ 350 billion for state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund; and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has received funds to be used for purposes designated by ARPA, and

WHEREAS, after a requests from the various political subdivisions of this county were made to Buffalo County for ARPA funds, this Board's Budget Committee reviewed these requests and has made recommendations to this Board as to an allocation of some of the ARPA funds that have been received by this County, and

WHEREAS, APRA provides funds to charitable and governmental entities to make necessary investments in structures and infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County pursuant to that committee's report on allocations, desires to allocate a portion of received ARPA Funds to the BUFFALO COUNTY COMMUNITY HEALTH PARTNERS, INC., a non-profit service Domestic Corporation, based in Kearney, Buffalo County, Nebraska, which is also known or referred to as "BUFFALO COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS", hereinafter simply referred to as "PARTNERS" to assist that organization to pay for the Childcare Champions program. This financial assistance of ARPA Funds is needed because this community based charitable organization has suffered negative economic impacts as a result of the COVID- 19 public health emergency and there is a need for PARTNERS' community based services; and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has determined that contracting with PARTNERS would yield efficiencies in time and process in the development and implementation of the goals of that organization.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY BUFFALO COUNTY, NEBRASKA, ACTING BY AND THROUGH THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that the Chairperson of this Board is hereby authorized, empowered,

and directed to execute an additional American Rescue Plan Act Agreement with the BUFFALO COUNTY COMMUNITY HEALTH PARTNERS, INC., for the financial assistance to PARTNERS to assist in the payment of the Childcare Champions Program, and to take all necessary steps required to complete the Project Agreement.

This financial assistance of ARPA Funds is needed because this community based charitable organization has suffered negative economic impacts as a result of the COVID- 19 public health emergency and there is a need for KCHS' community based services; and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has determined that contracting with KCHS would yield efficiencies in time and process in the development and implementation of the goals of that organization.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY BUFFALO COUNTY, NEBRASKA, ACTING BY AND THROUGH THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that the Chairperson of this Board is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to execute an additional American Rescue Plan Act Agreement with the KCHS, for the financial assistance to KCHS to assist in the payment of the outdoor athletics programs/structure, and to take all necessary steps required to complete the Project Agreement.

ZONING

Chairperson Klein opened the public hearing at 9:20 A.M. for the review, discussion and possible approval of the Buffalo County Zoning and Subdivision Regulations as part of the Buffalo County Comprehensive Plan, or the general plan for the improvement and development of the county outside of the jurisdiction of any city or village, as required per Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-174.06. Commissioner Loeffelholz presented the Buffalo County Board of Commissioners' Zoning Committee Meeting Report. He reported that on July 3, 2024, The Buffalo County Board of Commissioners' Zoning Committee met at 9:00 A.M. to discuss the proposed Zoning and Subdivision Regulations. Those in attendance were Dan Lynch, Bill Maendele, and Ron Loeffelholz, along with Zoning Administrator Dennise Daniels. The Zoning Committee, first and foremost, thanked The Planning Commission for all their hard work, time and effort to revise the regulations for the future of Buffalo County. The Zoning Committee, however, after review and discussion of the proposed Zoning and Subdivision Regulations, recommended referring the proposed Zoning and Subdivision Regulations back to The Planning Commission for discussion and revision based on the following considerations and recommendations: 1. Exceptions from Approval including Section 5.12, Section 5.14, Section 5.32, Section 5.34, Section 6.6, Section 5.44, Section 5.52, Section 5.54; 2. Ensuring all regulations support future developments/subdivisions occur along an existing paved road; 3. Rewording Zoning Regulations, Section 6.6 (B)(2) to "Any new or expanding livestock confinement facility/operation Greater than Class I, shall also be: No closer than one (1) mile from any property comprised of no less than 20 contiguous acres that is zoned AGR-1 or AGR-2."; 4. Rewording Subdivision Regulations, Section 1.05 to, "No subdivision of land, regardless of acreage involved, shall be permitted within the jurisdiction of Buffalo County unless the property subdivided and all portions therein abuts with a minimum width of twenty-five (25) feet and has

access to, before and after subdividing, a dedicated and maintained public street(s) and/or road(s), or private streets as private streets are allowed to be created in this Resolution (Resolution 7-13-2021)." No one else addressed the Board. Chairperson Klein closed the public hearing at 9:24 A.M. Moved by Maendele and seconded by Lynch to recommend re-referring the proposed Zoning/Subdivision Regulations to The Planning Commission for discussion and revision based on: 1. The Exceptions from Approval document enclosed in the Board's packet; 2. Adding verbiage to ensure all regulations support future developments/subdivisions occur along an existing paved road; 3. Adding verbiage to Section 6.6, requiring livestock confinement operations maintain 1-mile setbacks from areas zoned AGR – 1 and AGR – 2; but areas zoned AGR – 1 and AGR – 2 will be required to be contiguously comprised of 20 acres or more; and 4. Adding verbiage, which requires a 25-foot abutment to a private or dedicated road, for all subdivisions of land. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Maendele, Lynch, Higgins, Kouba, Loeffelholz, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Loeffelholz and seconded by Lynch to recess the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 9:30 A.M. and reconvene as a Board of Equalization. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Loeffelholz, Lynch, Maendele, Kouba, Higgins, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Lynch, Higgins, Kouba, Loeffelholz, Maendele, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Chairperson Klein opened the Permissive Exemption hearing for The Kearney Area Community Foundation at 9:34 A.M. President/CEO Judy Sickler was present to answer questions. No one else addressed the Board. Chairperson Klein closed the Permissive Exemption hearing at 9:36 A.M. Moved by Morrow and seconded by Maendele to approve The Kearney Area Community Foundation Permissive Exemption Application for parcel 603787100 as presented and as determined by the County Board to meet the statutory rules as required for exemption status. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Maendele, Lynch, Kouba, Higgins, Loeffelholz and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Loeffelholz and seconded by Higgins to approve Tax List Corrections numbered 5043 through 5044 submitted by County Assessor Meusch. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Loeffelholz, Higgins, Kouba, Lynch, Maendele, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Loeffelholz and seconded by Lynch to adjourn the Board of Equalization and return to the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 9:38 A.M. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Loeffelholz, Lynch, Maendele, Higgins, Kouba, Morrow and Klein. Motion declared carried.

Jon Cannon, Executive Director of the Nebraska Association of County Officials gave the Board an update.

Facilities Director Stephen Gaasch was present for the following two agenda items.

Chairperson Klein instructed County Clerk Christensen to open and read aloud the submitted bids for Public Defender addition as published by Wilkins Architecture Design Planning, LLC. Bids were submitted by the following companies: Hackel Construction, Central Contracting Corporation and DTC Duncan-Theis Construction. The Facilities Committee will review the bids and report back on July 23, 2024 with a decision.
