Zoning Administrator Dennise Daniels and Deputy County Attorney Hoffmeister were present for the following Zoning agenda items.

Chairperson Morrow opened the public hearing at 9:21 A.M. for an Administrative Subdivision filed by Mitchell Humphrey, licensed land surveyor, on behalf of Linda D. Pfortmiller, Trustee of the Nancy A. Hervert Revocable Trust, for an Administrative Subdivision to be known as "N A Hervert Administrative Subdivision." This property is located in Part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section Twelve (12), Township Eleven (11) North, Range Fourteen (14) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska. Licensed land surveyor Humphrey was present to answer any questions. Gwen Stengel, a Buffalo County resident did ask for clarification regarding the subdivision. No one else addressed the Board. Chairperson Morrow closed the hearing at 9:23 A.M. Moved by Higgins and seconded by Kouba to approve the Administrative Subdivision to be known as "N A Hervert Administrative Subdivision" with the following Resolution 2025-67. WHEREAS, Mitch Humphrey, licensed land surveyor, on behalf of Linda H. Pfortmiller, Trustee of the Nancy A. Hervert Revocable Trust, hereinafter referred to as "applicant", has filed for an Administrative Subdivision for "N A Hervert Administrative Subdivision", with the Buffalo County Clerk and/or Zoning Administrator, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Administrator forwarded this application to this Board, and WHEREAS, on November 10, 2025, this Board conducted a public hearing and finds:

- 1. The proposed "N A Hervert Administrative Subdivision" is in the Agriculture (AG) Zoning District for Buffalo County, Nebraska.
- 2. The tract, presently owned by Linda H. Pfortmiller, Trustee of the Nancy A. Hervert Revocable Trust, referred to as part of parcel 280025000, situated in part of the Southeast Quarter in Section Twelve (12), Township Eleven (11) North, Range Fourteen (14) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, has approximately 149.54 remnant acres.
- 3. The proposed plat for this subdivision fulfills Buffalo County's Subdivision Resolution requirements for administrative subdivisions specifically allowed under Section 3.02, together with other provisions applicable, thereto.
- 4. 265th Road is a county-maintained, open public road and it abuts the subdivision on its south side. The width of 265th Road meets this county's minimum width standards without the need of additional dedications.
- 5. Title search paperwork has been provided to the Buffalo County Attorney's Office and that office has cleared title as concerns Buffalo County's interests based upon the title search documents delivered to that office by applicant.
- 6. This proposed administrative subdivision should be approved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS in regular session with a quorum present, that the plat, "N A Hervert Administrative Subdivision", an administrative subdivision located in Part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section Twelve (12), Township Eleven (11) North, Range Fourteen (14) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, duly made out, acknowledged and certified, is hereby approved, accepted, ratified, and authorized to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Buffalo County, Nebraska.

Moved by Loeffelholz and seconded by Lynch to recess the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 9:25 A.M. and reconvene as a Board of Equalization. SIGNING OF THE YEAR-END CERTIFICATION OF COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT FORM 2025

Whereas: State of Nebraska Statues, sections 39-2302, and 39-2501 through 39-2505 detail the requirements that must be met in order for a county to qualify for an annual Incentive Payment; and

Whereas: The State of Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) requires that each county must annually certify (by December 31st of each year) the appointment(s) of the County Highway Superintendent(s) to the NDOT using the Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form; and

Whereas: The NDOT requires that such certification shall also include a copy of the documentation of the county highway superintendent's appointment, i.e., meeting minutes showing the appointment of the County Highway Superintendent by their name as it appears on their License (if applicable), their License Number (if applicable) and Class of License (if applicable), the type of appointment, i.e., employed or under contract (consultant, or interlocal agreement with another county and/or incorporated municipality), and the beginning date of the appointment; and

Whereas: The NDOT also requires that such Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form shall be signed by the County Board Chairperson and shall include a copy of a resolution of the County Board authorizing the signing of the Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form by the County Board Chairperson.

Be it resolved that the County Board Chairperson of Buffalo County is hereby authorized to sign the attached Year-End Certification of County Highway Superintendent form(s).



INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR

COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT AND USE OF THE

NEBRASKA REGIONAL INTEROPERABILITY NETWORK

- 1. Parties. The parties to this Agreement are Nebraska Public Agencies that are signatories hereto.
- 2. <u>Recitals</u>. This Agreement is based upon certain understandings and furtherance of certain purposes, as follows:
 - 2.1 The Interlocal Cooperation Act of the State of Nebraska (Neb.Rev.Stat. 13-801 et.seq. and all amendments thereto) enables separate political subdivisions of Nebraska to cooperate on the basis of mutual advantage to provide for joint undertakings, services and facilities.
 - 2.2 The equipment for the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network (NRIN), comprised of microwave and other methods of data communications, has been procured and installed to connect the parties.
 - 2.3 NRIN will benefit the parties by allowing information to be shared among emergency and communications centers on a real time, on demand, basis to help mitigate an emergency that threatens any location.
 - 2.4 NRIN will allow multi-jurisdictional, multi-disciplinary interoperability to ensure a competent level of local, regional, and statewide prevention, communication, cooperation, and coordination for an all-hazards incident necessary to execute a wide range of incident management operations.
 - 2.5 The parties agree that an NRIN Governing Board is necessary to effectively and efficiently operate NRIN.

3. Definitions.

- 3.1 <u>Act</u> means the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Neb.Rev.Stat. §§13-801 et. seq and all amendments thereto.
- 3.2 <u>Agreement</u> means this Agreement creating the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network
- 3.3 Board means the NRIN Governing Board
- 3.4 <u>Director</u> means a person serving on the NRIN Governing Board
- 3.5 Member means a Public Agency that is a party to this Agreement
- 3.6 <u>NRIN</u> means the Nebraska Regional Interoperability Network which provides data connectivity for public safety voice and data interoperability.
- 4. <u>Creation</u>. The undersigned Public Agency hereby joins with other signatory Public Agencies to create the NRIN with all the rights, powers, and privileges allowed under the Act.

- Purposes. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish NRIN and an NRIN Governing Board (Board) to govern, manage, and coordinate NRIN to support public safety communications in Nebraska.
- 6. <u>Duties</u>. The Board shall establish policies to ensure quality of service standards, priority of service, data replication and backup, security standards, equipment and replacement standards, maintenance standards, allocation of bandwidths, monitoring and testing standards, and other operational areas necessary for the effective and efficient operation of NRIN. The Board may enter into contracts for monitoring, management, and maintenance of NRIN; expertise to advise the Board in fulfilling its duties; leases for connections that support NRIN equipment; administrative functions to support the Board in fulfilling its duties; and other functions for the effective and efficient operation of NRIN. At least quarterly, the Board shall review NRIN use including traffic flow, usage patterns, and outages and make policy changes to improve NRIN functioning. The Board may establish bylaws, subcommittees and working groups necessary to fulfill its duties.
- 7. Property Ownership. The Board, through documented resolution, will determine ownership of any personal or real property acquired for purposes of furthering the goals and objectives of the Agreement. The Public Agency owning the property will be responsible for ensuring the property is either insured against damage or theft, or that the Public Agency is financially responsible for the property if it is damaged or stolen.
- 8. <u>Financial Plan</u>. The Board shall develop a financial plan identifying resources for sustainment of NRIN. The Board shall project expenses to effectively operate NRIN, project other revenue sources, and assess costs of NRIN users.
- 9. <u>Election of Board</u>. The Board shall consist of 16 elected Directors, two Directors representing each of the eight Planning Exercise and Training Regions established by the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency as follows:
 - 9.1 Each Member shall have one vote and will vote only for candidates who represent the region containing the public agency.
 - 9.2 Directors shall be elected for a three-year term of office. Directors may be re-elected for any number of terms. Directors shall serve staggered terms to promote stability and continuity.
- 10. <u>Withdrawal</u>. A Public Agency may withdraw from participation as a Member to the Agreement by written notice of termination evidenced by legally adopted resolution of the Member's governing body.
- 11. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall become effective upon passage of the attached Resolution for each Public Agency until withdrawal by that Public Agency.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement on the dates set forth in the attached Resolution.

Purpose and Key Provisions

- The purpose of this snow event parking plan is to articulate the policies, authorities, timelines and other necessary information as it relates to state and county employee parking around the courthouse property during a snow event.
- The primary objective of the Facility Snow Removal Plan and the Snow Event Parking Plan is to ensure and maintain a safe environment for all employees and for the general public doing business at the courthouse.
- The first priority in the Facility Snow Removal Plan is to clean the employee parking lots, typically starting at 4:30 am. Since these lots will be cleaned prior to employees arriving to work, it is important that during a snow event the county and state employees park in the permit lots or the lot south of the jail to help with the ease and safety of snow removal.

Definitions

- Snow Event
 - Any accumulation of snow that could cause an imminent safety hazard.
- Snow Event Parking Plan
 - This plan is to be used during a snow event to minimize hazardous conditions and facilitate the continual removal of accumulating snow and ice throughout the day.

Authorities

- A snow event will be determined by the Buffalo County Facilities Director with the assistance of the Board Chairman.
- Snow removal work will be performed by the Buffalo County Facilities, HWY, and Weeds departments.

<u>Timelines</u>

- When possible, the facilities director and/or his designee will notify all county and state employees and/or offices no later than 4:00 p.m. the day prior to the snow event.
- If the Facilities Director and/or his designee are unable to notify the officials prior to a snow event and there is ANY accumulation of snow on the ground, it is assumed to be a snow event.
- Typically, the snow removal will begin at 4:30 am, when possible, with the employee lots being cleaned first (by 7:00am), followed by the horseshoe parking lot and the east street parking (by 8:00am). The sidewalks and entrances should be cleaned by 7:30am.

BUFFALO COUNTY SNOW EVENT PARKING PLAN 2025-2026 Winter Season

The north side of the Courthouse will be the last to be cleaned, with lower priority due to this being an emergency snow route with no parking allowed on the 16th street.

• The snow event parking plan will remain in effect for the entire working day of the snow event unless notified by the facilities director that the snow event has ended early.

Parking Regulations

- County owned vehicles
 - If possible, all county owned vehicles should be parked in their assigned spots in the south employee parking lot (west of the Justice Center).
- State owned vehicles parking on County property
 - o If possible, all stated owned vehicles should be parked in their assigned spots in the south permit lot (west side of Justice Center).
- <u>Vehicles parked overnight in one of the lots during a snow event should park in the stalls around the perimeter of the lot, and preferably be grouped together.</u>
- Employee owned vehicles
 - o If possible, we would like to have all county and state employees park in the permit only lots, the east parking lot, or in the parking lot south of the jail.
 - We ask that no employee park on the street or in the horseshoe during a snow event without prior approval. Employee vehicles parked on the street or in the horseshoe during a snow event may be towed.
- Vehicles owned by members of the public
 - o Street parking and the horseshoe will be available for members of the public.
- PLEASE REMEMBER THAT 16TH STREET IS AN EMERGENCY SNOW ROUTE AND SHOULD NOT BE USED FOR PARKING WHEN THE CITY HAS DECLARED AN EMERGENCY SNOW EVENT.

Introduction

This memorandum presents an intersection control warrant evaluation for the intersection of 56th Street and Antelope Avenue in Buffalo County, NE. The objective of this memorandum is to determine if the intersection of 56th Street and Antelope Avenue satisfies warrants for all-way stop control. The determination will follow local and Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) criteria. The location of the study intersection is shown in **Figure 1**.

Data Collection

The data collection effort included collecting eight-hour movement counts (7-9 AM, 11 AM-2 PM, 3-6 PM) on a typical weekday. This was performed on Tuesday, July 15, 2025, and detailed count information is attached to this memorandum.

Approximately 3,000 vehicles passed through the intersection during the eight-hour period. The observed peak hours of flow are as follows: 7:00-8:00 AM, 11:45 AM-12:45 PM, and 4:30-5:30 PM. Heavy vehicle percentage is approximately 0% during the AM peak hour, 1% during the Midday peak hour, and 0.2% during the PM peak hour. No pedestrians or bikes were observed during the eight-hour counts.

A desktop review was completed related to characteristics of the intersection and immediate vicinity. 56th Street is a two-lane rural highway with a posted speed limit of 50 mph. Antelope Avenue is a two-lane rural highway with a posted speed limit of 55 mph. The intersection of the two roadways operates as two-way stop control with stop signs on the eastbound and westbound approaches. The stop sign assemblies are supplemented with solar powered flashing borders and "Cross Traffic Does Not Stop" warning signs. Both approaches also include stop ahead warning signs. One streetlight illuminates the intersection on an existing utility pole.

Adjacent land-uses in all four quadrants of the intersection are agricultural.

A summary of the existing traffic volumes, lane configuration, and capacity analysis is shown in **Figure 2**.








Existing Conditions




Lane Configuration & Traffic Control

Crash History

Three-year historical crash data was requested from Buffalo County for reduction. Crash data from January 1, 2022 through July 31, 2025 was analyzed to identify existing crash patterns at the intersection of 56th Street and Antelope Avenue. Identified crash patterns may be applicable to intersection control considerations.

Crash data is summarized in **Table 1**; crashes that occurred outside of the influence of the intersection are not presented.

In review of the crash data, there were a total of twenty-three crashes reported at the intersection over the 43-month period. Crash patterns can be identified from the analysis results:

- The most common violation was "failed to yield right-of-way" (13 crashes, 56.5%)
- Angle crashes occurred the most (11 crashes, 47.8%)
- March was the month with the most crashes (5 crashes, 21.7%)
- Tuesday was the day of the week with the most crashes (8 crashes, 34.8%)
- The majority of crashes occurred in the afternoon (17 crashes, 73.9%)
- The hours with the most crashes reported were 12PM (4 crashes, 17.4%) and 5PM (4 crashes, 17.4%)
- Of the twenty-three reported crashes, three resulted in possible injuries (3 crashes, 13.0%), seven resulted in suspected minor injuries (7 crashes, 30.4%), and one resulted in a fatality (1 crash, 4.3%).

One fatal crash occurred involving a motor vehicle and a bicycle. Both the vehicle and the bicycle were eastbound on 56th Street. The vehicle collided with the rear of the bicycle, resulting in the fatality of the bicyclist.

Intersection Control Evaluation

Intersection control decisions should be based on an engineering study, which evaluates factors related to the existing operation and safety at the intersection, the potential to improve these conditions, and the applicable factors contained in warrants specified by the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). The study for the intersection of 56th Street and Antelope Avenue evaluates alternate intersection control options of an all-way stop.

All-Way Stop Warrant Evaluation

The MUTCD provides guidance on when to install all-way stop control at intersections. There are five warrants provided:

- Warrant A Crash Experience
- Warrant B Sight Distance
- Warrant C Transition to Signal Control or Transition to Yield Control at a Circular Intersection
- Warrant D 8-Hour Volume
- Warrant E Other Factors

Additionally, the MUTCD states that the decision to install all-way stop control on site roadways open to public travel may be based on engineering judgement. Based on the available data, Warrant B, Warrant D, and Warrant E were evaluated for this study.



Warrant A - Crash Experience

Crash data information was presented in the *Crash History* section. As outlined in the MUTCD, the following criteria shall be met to satisfy the crash experience warrant.

- A. For a four-leg intersection, there are five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period or six or more reported crashes in a 36-month period that were of a type susceptible to correction by the installation of all-way stop control.
- B. For a three-leg intersection, there are four or more reported crashes in a 12-month period or five or more reported crashes in a 36-month period that were of a type susceptible to correction by the installation of all-way stop control.

Six angle crashes with "failed to yield right-of-way" violations occurred between August 2022 and July 2025. Therefore, the data meets the minimum number of reported crashes in a 36-month period that were susceptible to correction by the installation of all-way stop control. Condition A is satisfied; therefore, Warrant A is satisfied.

Warrant B - Sight Distance

Warrant B states that all-way stop control may be installed at an intersection where an engineering study indicates that sight distance on the minor-road approaches controlled by a STOP sign is not adequate for a vehicle to turn onto or cross the major (uncontrolled) road.

Through a desktop review, sight distance appears available for both eastbound and westbound approaches after stopping at the designated locations.

Warrant C – Transition to Signal Control or Transition to Yield Control at a Circular Intersection Warrant C states that all-way stop control may be installed at locations where all-way stop control is an interim measure that can be installed to control traffic while arrangements are being made for the installation of a traffic control signal at the intersection or for the installation of yield control at a circular intersection.

Warrant C is not applicable to the study intersection.

Warrant D - 8-Hour Volume (Vehicles, Pedestrians, Bicycles)

Eight-hour volume information was presented in the *Data Collection* section. As outlined in the MUTCD, the following criteria shall be met to satisfy the eight-hour volume warrant.

- A. The combined motor vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian volume entering the intersection from the major-street approaches is at least 300 units per hour for each of any 8 hours of a typical day; and
- B. The combined motor vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian volume entering the intersection from the minor-street approaches is at least 200 units per hour for each of any of the same 8 hours.

If the 85th-percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants may be reduced to 70 percent of the values given in Items A and B in this section.

Since the approach speed of Antelope Avenue exceeds 40 mph, the minimum traffic volumes required to satisfy warrant D are reduced to 210 units per hour for the major-street approaches and 140 units per hour for the minor street approaches. The total volumes and percentages of warrant volumes met are recorded in **Table 2** and **Table 3**.

The volumes do not meet the requirements of condition A, but do meet condition B. Since Warrant D requires both conditions to be met, Warrant D is not satisfied.



Warrant E - Other Factors

Warrant E states that all-way stop control may be installed at an intersection where an engineering study indicates that all-way stop control is needed due to other factors not addressed in the other all-way stop control warrants. Such other factors may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A. The need to control left-turn conflicts.
- B. An intersection of two residential neighborhood collector (through) streets of similar design and operating characteristics where all-way stop control would improve traffic operational characteristics of the intersection, or
- C. Where pedestrian and/or bicyclist movements support the installation of all-way stop control.

Condition A – Based on information available, there are not noteworthy left-turn conflicts. Condition B – The two streets are of similar design and operating characteristics. With LOS A or B for all movements during the peak hours, additional stoppage would not be expected to improve operations. Condition C – Pedestrian and bicyclist movements are not present and do not support the installation of all-way stop control.

Summary

This memorandum documents the results of the intersection control evaluation performed at the intersection of 56th Street and Antelope Avenue in Buffalo County, Nebraska. Existing intersection characteristics were reviewed, and the need for all-way stop control was evaluated using warrants prescribed in the MUTCD. Evaluation results are summarized in **Table 4**.

After review of available data, it was determined that one of the four evaluated all-way stop control warrants is satisfied by the existing conditions at the intersection of Antelope Avenue and 56th Street. Due to the high number of crashes and that a large portion of the crashes were susceptible to correction by all-way stop control, the crash experience of the study intersection justifies the implementation of all-way stop control. Therefore, installation of stop signs on the northbound and southbound approaches is recommended at this time.

Conversion of intersection traffic control must be complete and thorough, adhering to current design standards and best practices. Changes to the 56th Street approaches shall include removing the "Cross Traffic Does Not Stop" signs and installing the "All Way" (R1-3P) plaque. To implement stop control on the Antelope Avenue approaches, the standard sign sequence of "Stop Ahead" and combination of "Stop" and "All Way" shall be installed. Due to the rural nature of the intersection and change in control, additional enhanced conspicuity measures are recommended as outlined in the MUTCD. These include LEDs in the border of the Stop sign (similar to the existing condition for 56th Street) and vertical reflective strip on sign posts (for the Stop and the Stop Ahead signs). Additional consideration should be given to utilize a changeable message sign during the first week of conversion to bring additional warning to drivers.








Peak Hour - Motorized Vehicles










Peak Hour - Bicycles






Peak Hour - Motorized Vehicles
