BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION
TUESDAY, JULY 22, 2014
8:00 A.M.**

The Buffalo County Board of Supervisors and the Buffalo County Board of Equalization met on Tuesday, July 22, 2014 at 8:00 and 9:00 A.M. Chairman McMullen called the meeting to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following Board members responded to roll call: Francis Biehl, Joseph Brayton, Kent Greder, Ivan Klein, Sherry Morrow, Dennis Reiter and William McMullen. A copy of the acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda by the Board of Supervisors is attached to these minutes. Chairman McMullen announced that in accordance with Section 84-1412 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, a current copy of the Open Meetings Act is available for review. County Clerk Janice Giffin took all proceedings hereinafter shown; while the convened meeting was open to the public. Deputy County Attorney Kari Fisk was present.

REGULAR AGENDA

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Reiter to approve the July 8, 2014 and the July 15, 2014 Board meeting minutes. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Brayton, Reiter, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Morrow and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to accept the June 2014 Fund Balance Report from the County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

COURTHOUSE RENOVATIONS

Project Manager Steve Gaasch from Beckenhauer Construction was present to update the Board on the Phases 4-7 Courthouse Renovation Project. Buster Beckenhauer and Joe Beckenhauer were also present at this meeting. Gaasch presented and reviewed the Change Order requests of the Phase 4-7 Courthouse Renovation Project.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Klein to approve the following Change Order requests of the Phase 4-7 Courthouse Renovation Project: Change Order request #75 in the amount of \$2,750.00 to revise plumbing in the County Attorney’s office; Change Order request #76 for a credit amount of \$1,319.00 for previously approved work to abandon sewer & rainwater piping; Change Order request #77 in the amount of \$19,539.00 for removal and replacement of the County Attorney’s floor covering; Change Order request #78 for a credit amount of \$1,632.00 for floor tile material that was not needed in the basement bathroom. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Morrow, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

National Insurance Services sent information on the Life and Long Term Disability policy. Chairman McMullen called on each Board member present for committee reports and recommendations.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Greder to approve the following transfer of County funds all per budget. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Morrow, Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Brayton, Biehl, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Klein to set an auction date of August 25, 2014 at 2:00 P.M. for the sale of home and the shed to be removed from 11 W 14th Street, Kearney NE. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Brayton, Klein, Biehl, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Chairman McMullen discussed having an Employee Council; this decision was tabled until the August 12, 2014 Board Meeting.

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Klein to approve the following tax refund requests submitted by County Treasurer Sidwell: Lamoine and Dorothy Plautz in the amount of \$136.91 on parcel number 640022000, Ronald and Christine Johns in the amount of \$2,547.34 on parcel number 610001000 and Lonnie and Heather Jurgens in the amount of \$75.82 on parcel number 640022000. Upon

roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Brayton, Klein, Biehl, Greder Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Reiter and seconded by Brayton to approve the written procedure and the noxious weed complaint form available to Buffalo County citizens. The noxious weed complaint form will be filed with the Buffalo County Weed Control Department. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Reiter, Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Morrow and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Highway Superintendent Ron Sklenar was present for the following Agenda items. Moved by Brayton and seconded by Morrow to add Project Number C10 (1432) Buffalo County and C40 (431) Hall County to the One Year Program. This joint Project calls for a superstructure Deck Rehabilitation to ensure a safe and effective driving surface for the traveling public. The Project will be contracted through Hall County with Buffalo County’s approval at an estimated cost of \$52,000.00 or cost of \$26,000.00 for each county. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Brayton, Morrow, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Biehl to set a public hearing date of August 26, 2014 at 10:00 A.M. for discussion on the permanent closure of a crossing in Buffalo County. This request to close the Webb Street grade crossing in Odessa comes from the Union Pacific Railroad. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried. (Motion rescinded later in this meeting.)

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Greder to authorize Buffalo County Board Chairman Bill McMullen to sign on behalf of Buffalo County the Application for Payment and the Change Order No. 1 indicating the new Contract Price for Buffalo County in the amount of \$825,871.00 instead of \$836,734.17 for the 56th Street and Avenue M Paving Project. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Morrow, Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Biehl and seconded by Brayton to recess the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors at 9:04 A.M. and reconvene as a Board of Equalization. Deputy County Attorney Kari Fisk excused herself from the meeting. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. At 11:30 A.M. County Treasurer Jean Sidwell was present for the following motor vehicle tax exemption applications.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Klein to rescind the motion earlier in this meeting to set a public hearing. The Board of Supervisors will ask the Highway Superintendent to report his recommendation on the closure of the crossing at the next meeting on August 12, 2014. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Greder, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Chairman McMullen opened the public hearing on the Adult Entertainment Ordinance to amend provisions relating to the applicability of this ordinance at 12:00 P.M. Deputy County Attorney Andrew Hoffmeister and Deputy County Attorney Kari Fisk were present. Also addressing the Board were Jonathan Canterbury and his legal counsel Mike Carper. Presenting a letter that was addressed to the Board was a citizen who refused to identify himself stating that the letter was prepared by another individual and he was only delivering the letter. The letter presented was signed by Paul St John. Chairman McMullen closed the hearing at 12:06 P.M.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to execute their right to waive the three readings as required by statutes and to waive reading of the amendment to the ordinance in full prior to amendment. Moved by Biehl and seconded by Reiter to amend the Adult Entertainment Establishment Ordinance with the following Resolution 2014-37. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

RESOLUTION 2014-37

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2014, the Board passed Resolution #2014-031 setting down July 22, 2014, as the first public hearing and first reading of proposed amendment to Buffalo County's Adult Entertainment Establishment Ordinance originally adopted by this Board in Resolution #2014-006, and

WHEREAS, a copy of that resolution with the proposed amendment to ordinance in its entirety was published for two consecutive weeks, with the last publication not less than five (5) days nor more than two weeks prior to the first public hearing. Additionally a copy of the proposed ordinance was sent by the County Clerk to all Village and City Clerks of Buffalo County prior to the first public meeting of the proposed ordinance, and

WHEREAS, during the public hearing held July 22, 2014, this Board found that the proposed amendment clarified language as to the applicability Resolution #2014-006 with various parties speaking favorably to the proposed amendment and no parties opposing the amendment, and

WHEREAS, by separate motion, this Board suspended the requirement set forth in Sec. 23-190 Neb.Rev.Stat. that the proposed amendment to ordinance be read by title on three different days prior to adoption of it as an ordinance of this County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors adopts the following amendment and

Be it ordained by the County Board of the County of Buffalo, State of Nebraska, that SECTION F.APPLICABILITY of the Adult Entertainment Establishment Ordinance, as authorized pursuant to Neb.Rev.Stat. §23-174.10 and § 23-187, and adopted by this Board in Resolution 2014-06, be amended to read:

SECTION F. APPLICABILITY:

This ordinance shall be effective within the boundaries of Buffalo County, Nebraska, except those areas inside of the corporate boundaries of any city or village or outside the corporate boundaries of any city or village in which such city or village is exercising powers by ordinance on a similar subject matter to which this ordinance pertains. An existing Adult Entertainment Establishment now in existence at time of adoption of this ordinance that violates any distancing requirement of this ordinance shall be allowed to continue to exist but shall not be allowed to expand its business. If an existing Adult Entertainment Establishment now in existence ceases to be operational for any span of one hundred eighty (180) days, it shall not be allowed to reopen and any future use of the building, property, and premises shall conform to this ordinance.”

Randell Manning has filed a request for a vacation of an administrative subdivision for property described as Lot 1, Manning Administrative Subdivision, an administrative subdivision being part of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 26, Township 11 North, Range 13 West of the 6th p.m., Buffalo County, Nebraska. Deputy County Attorney Andrew Hoffmeister and Randell Manning reviewed the application. Chairman McMullen closed the hearing at 12:24 P.M. Moved by Biehl and seconded by Greder to approve the following Resolution 2014-38 to vacate the administrative subdivision. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Biehl, Greder, Brayton, Klein, Morrow, Reiter, and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

RESOLUTION 2014-38

WHEREAS, Randell H. Manning, owner of Lot One (1) Manning Administrative Subdivision, located in part of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section Twenty-Six (26), Township Eleven (11) North, Range Thirteen (13), West of the 6th p.m., Buffalo County, Nebraska, filed to vacate this administrative subdivision with the Buffalo County Clerk and/or Zoning Administrator, and

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2014 this Board conducted a public hearing considering this request and finds:

1. The proposed vacation request is vacate the subdivision of land that was previously subdivided by use of the administrative subdivision process. It is for property that is situated in the Agricultural (AG) Zoning District for Buffalo County, Nebraska.
2. The proposed vacation of the entire administrative subdivision fulfills Buffalo County's Subdivision Resolution requirements for vacation of administrative subdivisions as specifically allowed under Section 3.21 together with other provisions applicable thereto.
3. No public utilities occupy the land sought to be vacated or if they do, they occupy original sixty-six foot right of way of 227th Road.
4. The additional seven (7) foot right of way dedicated to Buffalo County when Manning Administrative Subdivision is not necessary to retain in that 227th Road is not a section line road and it is not contiguous to an intersection where an increased right of way for road intersection purposes would be desirable.
5. The proposed vacation of subdivided land should be approved and the land dedicated to public road purposes should revert to adjacent landowner(s).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the proposed vacation of this administrative subdivision is approved.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this Resolution, when it is filed with the Buffalo County Register of Deeds against the above named legal description, shall cause the vacation of previously subdivided land.

RESOLVED FURTHER that seven foot right of way along 227th Road dedicated to Buffalo County when Manning Administrative Subdivision was created shall revert back to owner(s) of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section Twenty-Six (26), Township Eleven North, Range Thirteen (13), West of the 6th p.m., Buffalo County, Nebraska.

Chairman McMullen announced that following adjournment the quarterly inspection of the Buffalo County Jail would be conducted by two Board members. Chairman McMullen asked if there was anything else to come before the Board at 3:17 P.M. before he declared the meeting adjourned until the regular meeting at 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, August 12, 2014.
