The Buffalo County Board of Supervisors and the Buffalo County Board of Equalization met on Tuesday, August 26, 2014 at 9:00 and 10:30 A.M. Chairman McMullen called the meeting to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. #### **RESOLUTION 2014-49**

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has acquired properties surrounding the Courthouse that are in the City of Kearney's M-1 Zoning District, and

WHEREAS, the investigation by the Construction Manager of Kearney's zoning policies and districts concludes that the Central Business District (CBD) would be the most favorable zoning district for Lots 1512 and 1513, all in Original Town of Kearney Junction, now City of Kearney, Buffalo County, Nebraska, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County, to make full use of properties that it owns situated on the east side of First Avenue between 14<sup>th</sup> Street and 15<sup>th</sup> Street, Kearney, Nebraska, and to create a consistent street and property line along 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, from the south line of 16<sup>th</sup> Street to the north line of 14<sup>th</sup> Street, it would be desirable that the east fifteen (15) feet of First Avenue, as originally laid out, be vacated, if not previously vacated, and

WHEREAS, it would be desirable for the same foregoing reasons to vacate the alley abutting Lots 1510, 1511, 1512, and 1513, all in Original Town of Kearney Junction, now City of Kearney, Buffalo County, Nebraska.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THAT the Buffalo County Attorney's Office is directed and authorized to proceed on behalf of Buffalo County, Nebraska, to apply to the City of Kearney and any other entity to secure City of Kearney Zoning Map amendment for Buffalo County's real estate described below from City of Kearney Zoning District M-1 to CBD and do all acts necessary to accomplish the same, with the properties generally described as: Lots 1512 and 1513, all in Original Town of Kearney Junction, now City of Kearney, Buffalo County, Nebraska,

### **RESOLUTION 2014-026 AMENDMENT**

WHEREAS, on May 24, 2014, in Resolution 2014-026, recorded in the Buffalo County, Register of Deeds Office on June 4, 2014, at 2014-03418, this Board vacated what was formally known as Odessa Road, excepting the east 33 feet of Section 9, 16, 21, and 28, Township 9, Range 17, West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Buffalo County, Nebraska, and

WHEREAS, an error was made in the describing the present width of the road right of way for Odessa Road as it now exists, in that Buffalo County, by condemnation, deed, or otherwise, acquired a one hundred foot right of way, comprised by fifty foot and not thirty-three foot, right-of-way on each side of the north to south section line when Odessa Road was relocated to its present location, in the mid-1960's, and

WHEREAS, the real estate description for the road vacated in Resolution 2014-026 should be amended and refiled to reflect Buffalo County's correct right of way, and

WHEREAS, the amended vacation should be filed against the applicable real estate parcels to memorialize this road vacation for the public real estate records of Buffalo County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS by a vote of majority of its members, that Resolution #2010-026 is amended as to the road description that was vacated to state:

All of that portion of a previously used public road once known as "Odessa Road" and located within the East Half of Sections Nine (9), Sixteen (16), Twenty-One (21), and Twenty-Eight (28), Township Nine (9) North, Range Seventeen (17), West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Buffalo County, Nebraska, with this public road more particularly described as:
