BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION
TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 2014
9:00 A.M.**

The Buffalo County Board of Supervisors and the Buffalo County Board of Equalization met on Tuesday, September 23, 2014 at 9:00 and 10:15 A.M. Chairman McMullen called the meeting to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following Board members responded to roll call: Francis Biehl, Joseph Brayton, Kent Greder, Ivan Klein, Sherry Morrow, Dennis Reiter and William McMullen. A copy of the acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda by the Board of Supervisors is attached to these minutes. Chairman McMullen announced that in accordance with Section 84-1412 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, a current copy of the Open Meetings Act is available for review. County Clerk Janice Giffin took all proceedings hereinafter shown; while the convened meeting was open to the public. County Attorney Shawn Eatherton was present.

REGULAR AGENDA

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Biehl to approve the September 9, 2014 Board meeting minutes. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Reiter to approve the Community Action Partnership of Mid-Nebraska R.Y.D.E. August 2014 Report. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Reiter, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Klein and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Carol Schwarz, Extension Educator was present to give a report on the culinary workshop in Vermont and the National Extension Association annual meeting in Kentucky that she attended in September.

Project Manager Steve Gaasch contacted the Board before the meeting started to let them know that the final Change Order requests were not compiled for action.

Chairman McMullen reviewed the following correspondence. Newsletters were received from Pipeline Association and Emeritus at Northridge Place. Correspondence was received on the Nebraska Water Laws and Regulations Seminar that will be held in November. The City of Kearney sent notification of the annexation of Tacha Addition. Chairman McMullen called on each Board member present for committee reports and recommendations.

Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Klein, Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

IT Department Network Manager Cody Nelson was present to discuss the Interlocal Agreement with the Village of Pleasanton. Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to authorize Chairman McMullen to sign the Interlocal Agreement with the Village of Pleasanton for Aerial Photography Sharing. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried. Nelson also presented the IT Department quarterly report.

At 10:00 A.M., Chairman McMullen opened the public hearing to abandon the railroad crossing located at the Webb Street crossing in the unincorporated Village of Odessa. Deputy County Attorneys Andrew Hoffmeister and Kari Fisk were present. The Highway Superintendent report recommending that the crossing remain open was noted again in this meeting. No one to speak in favor or against the closing was present and Chairman McMullen closed the public hearing at 10:04 A.M. A decision regarding this crossing will be made at the October 14, 2014 Board meeting.

SUPPORTING A REQUEST TO THE NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ROADS BOARD OF PUBLIC ROADS

CLASSIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS

FOR THE RELAXATION OF STANDARDS FOR DESIGN LOADING

FOR THE BRIDGE ON WISEMAN ROAD NORTH OF US HIGHWAY 30

WHEREAS, Hall County and Buffalo County entered into an interlocal agreement on August 12, 2014 for a project to rehabilitate the bridge on Wiseman Road north of US Highway 30 with a new concrete deck under Hall County project number C40 (431) and Buffalo County project number C10 (1432): and

WHEREAS, the Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards (BPRCS) do not have a category for bridge rehabilitation, thereby requiring HL93 design loading for the superstructure and substructure on this project; and

WHEREAS, the deck is being replaced using HL93 design loading for the superstructure and the substructure is not being rehabilitated as part of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Buffalo County, Nebraska understand the necessity for the relaxation of standards for design loading for the bridge substructure on Wiseman Road north of US highway 30.

THEREFORE, the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors support the request from the Hall County Engineer to the Nebraska Department of Roads Board of Public Roads Classification and Standards for the relaxation of design standards to not require the substructure for the bridge on Wiseman Road to be designed for HL93 design loading.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to recess the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors at 10:15 A.M. and reconvene as a Board of Equalization. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

WHEREAS, Buffalo County employees are currently paid one time per month.

WHEREAS, in order to remain in compliance with numerous regulations, state and federal law a transition from the County's current payroll policies is necessary.

WHEREAS, Buffalo County believes this transition will benefit employees.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Buffalo County to transition to a bi-weekly pay cycle in which employees are paid every 14 days.

WHEREAS, this Sunday through Saturday pay period can effectively be initiated in February, 2015.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that effective February 1, 2015 all Buffalo County employees will be paid bi-weekly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board will work in conjunction with the County Clerk, County Attorney, and Board Administrator to develop all plans, policies and paperwork necessary to complete this transition.

Chairman McMullen opened up the discussion on the possibility of offering short term disability insurance to employees. This Agenda item was turned over to the Personnel Committee.

ZONING

Sucha and Super M Farms, was present to review an administrative subdivision application for property described as part of the South Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 32, Township 11 North, Range 15 West of the 6th p.m., Buffalo County, Nebraska to be known as Super M Farms Administrative Subdivision. Chairman McMullen closed this public hearing at 11:04 A.M. Moved by Brayton and seconded by Biehl to approve the Administrative Subdivision application with the following Resolution 2014-59. WHEREAS, Mitchell Humphrey, Licensed Surveyor, on behalf of Super M Farms, L.L.C., a Nebraska Limited Liability Company and Ann M. Sucha and Paul A. Sucha, wife and husband, owners hereinafter referred to as "applicant", has filed for an administrative Subdivision to be known as "SUPER M FARMS ADMINISTRATIVE SUBDIVISION" with the Buffalo County Clerk and/or Zoning Administrator, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Administrator forwarded this application to this Board, and

WHEREAS, on September 23, 2014, this Board conducted a public hearing and now finds:

1. The proposed SUPER M FARMS ADMINISTRATIVE SUBDIVISION is in the Agricultural (AG) Zoning District for Buffalo County, Nebraska and the size of the lot after subdividing complies with the minimum lot size requirements of that Zoning District.
2. The proposed plat for this subdivision fulfills Buffalo County's Subdivision Resolution requirements for administrative subdivisions specifically allowed under Section 3.02 together with other provisions applicable thereto.
3. 205TH Road is a county maintained open public road that abuts the proposed subdivision. The width of this road after dedication complies with minimum width standards required by the Buffalo County Subdivision Resolution.

4. Title search paperwork has been provided to the Buffalo County Attorney's Office and that office has cleared title as concerns Buffalo County based upon the title search documents delivered to that office by applicant.
5. This proposed administrative subdivision should be approved.
