Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to appoint Barb Pemberton Riege (Barb Pemberton Riege was previously the alternate member for the Board) and reappoint Larry Fox to the Board of Adjustment for a three year term. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Klein and seconded by Brayton to reappoint Willie Keep, Marlin Heiden and Paul Steinbrink, Sr. to the Planning and Zoning Commission for a three year term. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Klein, Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Klein to accept the bid from Principal Insurance for the Voluntary Employee Dental Insurance plan and to notify MetLife of the cancellation of services effective January 1, 2017. Sealed bids were opened on November 8, 2016 and Tim Shada and Gene Beerbohm will be the local agents for the new policy. County Sheriff Neil Miller was present to discuss the purchase of new Sheriff Department vehicles per the State of Nebraska contract. Moved by Klein and seconded by Biehl to approve the purchase of one 2017 Dodge Charger Police AWD in the amount of \$26,861.00, a 2017 Ford Police Utility Vehicle (PUV) in the amount of \$28,294.00, a 2017 Chevrolet Silverado ½ ton crew cab in the amount of \$30,183.00 and a 2017 Ford Police F-150 ½ ton crew cab in the amount of \$29,975.00. Chairman McMullen reviewed the following correspondence. Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality sent a notice proposing to modify/update Title 122-Rules and Regulations for Underground Injection and Mineral Production Wells and information about the permit for storm water discharge. Hobby Lobby sent a letter stating the employees or owners will not receive gifts of any value from vendors. The Board received a thank you from the Extension for the use of a van for National Conference and Cat Financial Team sent a Thanksgiving Greetings card.

### **ZONING**

Zoning Administrator LeAnn Klein and Deputy County Attorney Kari Fisk were present for the following Zoning agenda items. Chairman McMullen opened the Zoning hearing at 9:15 A.M. for an administrative subdivision to be known as Hadwiger Fourth Administrative Subdivision. Mitchell Humphrey on behalf of Terry and Teresa Hadwiger filed a request for an administrative subdivision for property described as part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 8, Township 10 North, Range 16 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska. Mitch Humphrey was present to review the application. No one else addressed the Board and Chairman McMullen closed the hearing at 9:17 A.M. Moved by Greder and seconded by Brayton to approve the Zoning Map Amendment with the following Resolution 2016-52. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Brayton, Biehl, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

### **RESOLUTION 2016-52**

WHEREAS, Mitchell Humphrey, licensed surveyor, on behalf of Terry Hadwiger and Teresa Hadwiger, husband and wife, hereinafter referred to as “applicant” have filed for an Administrative Subdivision to be known as “HADWIGER FOURTH ADMINISTRATIVE SUBDIVISION” with the Buffalo County Clerk and/or Zoning Administrator, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Administrator forwarded this application to this Board, and

WHEREAS, on November 22, 2016, this Board conducted a public hearing and now finds:

1. The proposed “HADWIGER FOURTH ADMINISTRATIVE SUBDIVISION” is in the Agricultural Residential (AGR) Zoning District for Buffalo County, Nebraska and the size of the parcels of real estate owned by the subdividing entity after subdividing complies with the minimum lot size of this zoning district. In relevant part, in the AGR District, Buffalo

County's Zoning Resolution provides that the three acre minimum in a proposed and approved subdivision may be reduced to 70,000 square feet subject to review and compliance by Nebraska Department of Health and approval of County Board of Commissioners.

2. The proposed plat for this subdivision fulfills Buffalo County's Subdivision Resolution requirements for administrative subdivisions specifically allowed under Section 3.02 together with other provisions applicable thereto.
3. 175<sup>th</sup> Road and Riverdale Road are county maintained open public roads that abut the proposed subdivision to the south and west. The width of these roads after dedication complies with the minimum width standards required by the Buffalo County Subdivision Resolution.
4. Title search paperwork has been provided to the Buffalo County Attorney's Office and that office has cleared title as concerns Buffalo County's interests based upon the title search documents delivered to that office by applicant.
5. This proposed administrative subdivision should be approved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS in regular session with a quorum present, that the plat of "HADWIGER FOURTH ADMINISTRATIVE SUBDIVISION", an administrative subdivision being described as being part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter located in Section 8, Township 10 North, Range 16 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, duly made out, acknowledged and certified, is hereby approved, accepted, ratified, and authorized to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Buffalo County, Nebraska.

Chairman McMullen reopened the Zoning hearing for a Preliminary Plat filed by Mitchell Humphrey on behalf of Josiah & Marcile Woodward for property described as being part of the Southeast Quarter of Fractional Section 7, Township 9 North, Range 16 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska to be known as Woodward Estates Third. This hearing was opened on November 8, 2016 and the Board had concerns of the road into the subdivision and the utility easements. Mitch Humphrey and Josiah Woodward were present to address the Board. Assistant Highway Superintendent John Maul was present to discuss the condition of the road into the subdivision and the trees that will have to be removed. Chairman McMullen closed the hearing at 9:28 A.M. Moved by Klein and seconded by Biehl to approve the Preliminary Plat with the following Resolution 2016-53. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

### **RESOLUTION 2016-53**

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2016, the Buffalo County Planning & Zoning Commission after public hearing gave a favorable recommendation to Woodward Estates Third, a proposed subdivision of land, together with various suggestions and recommendations all as stated in the minutes of that meeting of the Commission that have been forwarded to this Board, and reviewed by this Board, and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2016 and recessed to November 22, 2016, this Board after public hearing considered approval of the preliminary plat for Woodward Estates Third, and

WHEREAS, the plan of development appears to be compliant with Buffalo County's Subdivision Resolution, with the exception of the following provisions which shall be incorporated into the preliminary and final plat PRIOR to submission of final plat:

1. Relaxation of easements as noted and shown on the plat from Tall Grass, Black Hills Energy, Frontier and Dawson Public Power Co.
2. Private easement shall be notated on the east and west sides of the private road on the east side of Lot 4, Block 1.
3. Private road language shall be shown on the preliminary and final plat prior to filing.
4. That the length of 88<sup>th</sup> Street should be brought up to County design standards and that:
  - a. Trees in the right-of-way of 88<sup>th</sup> Street shall be removed prior to the final plat.
  - b. Additional gravel shall be applied to the road top per design standards.
  - c. Seeding of the ditches shall be completed before final plat or, if weather does not permit seeding, arrangements be made to have it seeded as soon as possible.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS in regular session with a quorum present, that Buffalo County, on a preliminary basis, approves the proposed Woodward Estates Third, a subdivision being part of a tract of land being part of the South Half of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (S ½ NE ¼ SE ¼ ) and part of the North Half of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (N ½ SE ¼ SE ¼ ) of Fractional Section 7, Township 9 North, Range 16 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, containing 36.88 acres, more or less, of which 0.96 acres, more or less, are presently being used for road purposes on the East side.

FURTHER RESOLVED that is not approval of a Final Plat and a copy of this Resolution is not to be filed against the foregoing real estate.

Commissioner Sherry Morrow excused herself at 9:45 A.M.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Reiter to recess the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 9:46 A.M. and reconvene as a Board of Equalization. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Reiter, Biehl, Brayton, Klein and McMullen. Absent: Morrow. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

**BOARD OF EQUALIZATION**

Chairman McMullen called the Board of Equalization to order in open session. County Treasurer Jean Sidwell was present.

Moved by Biehl and seconded by Reiter to approve Motor Vehicle Tax Exemption as indicated on the application by County Treasurer Sidwell for Goodwill Industries of Greater Nebraska Inc. on a 2013 Dodge Caravan SXT, 2010 Dodge Grand Caravan, 2013 Hyundai Accent and a 2013 Chevrolet Impala. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Biehl, Reiter, Brayton, Greder, Klein and McMullen. Absent: Morrow. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Klein to adjourn the Board of Equalization and return to the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners at 9:50 A.M. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Reiter, and McMullen. Absent: Morrow. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Chairman McMullen called on each Board member present for committee reports and recommendations.

**REGULAR AGENDA**

Linda Zinnel and Liz Lockhorn representing the Ravenna Area Vision Foundation (RAV) were present to discuss the Buffalo County Recreational Area located near the City of Ravenna. Liz Lockhorn presented timeline information gathered by the RAV Foundation. After discussion, it was moved by Brayton and seconded by Greder that Buffalo County enter into and approve an Interlocal Agreement as drafted by the Buffalo County Attorney’s Office, with the same to be forwarded to the City of Ravenna for its consideration. During discussion it was clarified that the Buffalo County Highway Department was to be the entity responsible for accounting for and disbursing any public funds. Thereafter the Interlocal Agreement was approved by this Board with the following Board members voting “Aye”: Brayton, Greder, Biehl, Klein, Reiter, and McMullen. Absent: Morrow. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried. The Chairperson announced that Buffalo County had approved the proposed Agreement, and it would be forwarded to the City of Ravenna for that entities’ consideration of the same. Upon the receipt of a signed Interlocal Agreement from the City of Ravenna to this Board, this Board would then formally adopt a Resolution indicating adoption of it by both entities.

The Board discussed the appointment of members to the Ravenna Lake Park Board and the decision was tabled until the December 13, 2016 meeting.

ADA Coordinator Lynn Martin was present to review the Americans with Disabilities Act Transition Plan with the Board and no action was taken at this time. ADA Coordinator Lynn Martin will be available for the public to review and/or comment on the Buffalo County ADA Transition Plan on December 13, 2016 from 1:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M.

Moved by Biehl and seconded by Klein to approve the following November 2016 vendor claims and the Election claims submitted by the County Clerk. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Biehl, Klein, Brayton, Greder, Reiter and McMullen. Absent: Morrow. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.
