The Buffalo County Board of Commissioners and the Buffalo County Board of Equalization met on Tuesday, April 26, 2022 at 9:00 A.M. and 9:30 A.M. Vice Chairman Morrow called the meeting to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Vice Chairman Morrow reviewed the following correspondence. Nebraska Emergency Management Agency sent a thank you letter acknowledging that Emergency Management Director Darrin Lewis participated on the Nebraska Incident Management Assistance Team that responded to the fires in Gosper and Furnas Counties. Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) sent the monthly status report update on the Poole South project. Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice sent the annual State of Nebraska Jail Standards Inspection Report. Kearney Area Chamber of Commerce sent a letter stating they partnered with Livability Media to create an engaging, high-impact campaign to show why Kearney is a great place to live and work. Vice Chairman Morrow called on each Board member present for committee reports and recommendations.

Vice Chairman Morrow called for Citizen's forum. Sheriff Neil Miller talked about an event called "National Prescription Drug Take Back Day," which is April 30, 2022 and a possible ribbon cutting date of June 1, 2022 for the Tower project. No one else addressed the Board.
