

Village of Shelton, Nebraska **Swimming Pool Bonds** 

Shall the Village of Shelton, Nebraska, borrow money and pledge the property and credit of the Village upon its negotiable bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$3,500,000.00) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new swimming pool and related improvements for the Village on land owned by the Village; said bonds to be dated and become due and payable, both principal and interest, on such date or dates as may be fixed by the Chairperson and Board of the Village at the time of their issuance and to bear interest at such rate or rates as shall be determined by the Chairperson and Board of the Village; and

Shall the Village cause to be levied and collected annually, a special levy of taxes on the taxable value of all the taxable property in the Village, and all other taxes, in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds, to the extent not paid from other sources, as such principal and interest become due?



A "Yes" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such questions shall be in favor of issuing bonds, the Village shall construct and equip a swimming pool and related improvements and shall issue bonds in the principal amount of up to \$3,500,000 to pay for construction of the swimming pool and related improvements. To the extent not paid from other sources, the funds for repayment of the bonds will come from an ad valorem tax on all the taxable property in the Village.
