Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th, May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John L. Steward has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

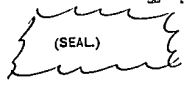
lots numbered seven and eight of section twelve, and the lots numbered six and seven of section thirty in township eight north of Range sixteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty acres and forty hundredths of an acre.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John L. Steward the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John L. Steward and to his heirs and assigns forever.
