Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Johann Windorf has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South Half of the South East quarter of Section Fourteen in Township Twelve North of Range T. Tenth West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Nebraska, containing Eighty Acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Johann Windorf the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Johann Windorf and to his heirs and assigns forever.
