To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

No. 3659 } Whereas Mary E. Armstrong, formerly Mary E. W. W. of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Mary E. Armstrong according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the note supplemental thereto, for the North half of the North East quarter, the South West quarter of the North East quarter and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section six in Township eleven North of Range eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres and forty eight hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Mary E. Armstrong.

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises aforesaid in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Mary E. Armstrong and to her heirs, the said tract above described, To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Mary E. Armstrong and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the Twenty ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
