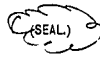

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Saline, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Miley Asher has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the south west quarter of section twenty two in township seven north of Range sixteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing Eighty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: and the acts supplemental thereto for the said half of the south west quarter of section twenty two in township seven north of Range sixteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing Eighty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Miley Asher Now Know Ye that that the United States of America is considered as the possessor and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided heretofore and granted and by these Presents do give and grant unto the said Miley Asher according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Miley Asher the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Miley Asher and to his heirs and assigns forever.
