 In all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Loyd Austin of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Loyd Austin according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 4th of April, 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the North West Quarter of the North East Quarter of Section thirty two in Township ten north of Range eighteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing forty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said Tract has been purchased by the said Loyd Austin. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the promises ^{and} in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made ^{and} provided here given ^{and} granted ^{and} by these presents do give ^{and} grant unto the said Loyd Austin ^{and} to his heirs the said Tract above described to have ^{and} to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities ^{and} appurtenances of what ever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Loyd Austin ^{and} to his heirs ^{and} assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent ^{and} the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the twenty ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred ^{and} eighty nine ^{and} of the Independence of the United States the one hundred ^{and} fourteenth.
