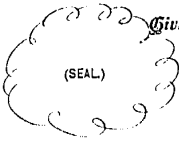

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John H. Darby has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North half of the South West quarter and the South half of the North West quarter of Section eight in Township nine, North, of Range thirteen west in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John H. Darby the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John H. Darby and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Ulysses S. Grant President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

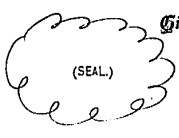

Ayer has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North half of the South East quarter of Section thirty, in Township ten North, of Range thirteen west in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Louis N. Ayer the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Louis N. Ayer and to her heirs and assigns forever.
