To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office
of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office
at Grand Island, ^{Nebraska} whereby it appears that pursuant to the
Acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and
June 14, 1878 "To encourage the growth of timber on the
Western Prairies" the claim of Charles Abel has been established
and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South
East quarter of Section Thirty Two in Township Twelve North
of Range Eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in
Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres accord-
ing to the Official plat of the survey of the said land returned
to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States
unto the said Charles Abel the tract of Land above described
to have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appur-
tenances thereof unto the said Charles Abel and to his
heirs and assigns forever.

of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made
Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
affixed.
