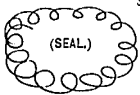

APPLICATION 6332 } Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John P. Aрендт has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the west half of the south-west quarter and the south half of the north-west quarter of Section twenty-eight, in township nine north, of range eighteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John P. Aрендт the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John P. Aрендт and to his heirs and assigns forever.

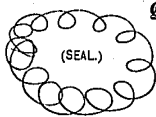
