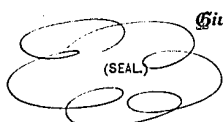

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Jakob Bachmann the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Jakob Bachmann and to his heirs and assigns forever.
