Bannow of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the general land office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that Full Payment has been made by the said James W. Bannow according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1850 entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the north west quarter of section one in Township Twelve north of Range Seventeen, west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska - containing one hundred and sixty acres and seventy two hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said James W. Bannow - Now Know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and Grant, unto the said James W. Bannow and to his heirs, the said Tracts above described, To have and To hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thenceforth belonging, unto the said James W. Bannow and to his heirs and assigns forever.
