

Certificate } No. 3193 } To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting.

Know all men that whereas George W. Barrus of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said George W. Barrus according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the West Half of the North West Quarter of Section twenty-four in Township twelve, North of Range eighteen, West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing eighty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said George W. Barrus. Now know ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said George W. Barrus and to his heirs, the said tract above described; to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of what ever nature, thereto belonging unto the said George W. Barrus and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
