The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 3, 1874, and June 14, 1878 "To encourage the growth of timber on the Western prairies" the claim of Alonzo Bramley has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law in the North West quarter of Section Sixty two in Township twelve North, of Range Thirteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plan of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Alonzo Bramley the tract of land above described to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereto unto the said Alonzo Bramley and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, G. Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

This instrument made this sixth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred and ninety two between Conrad Bruckner and Anna his wife of Fredonia, Calhoun County, Mich, party of the first part and Rachel J. Bruckner, Cherry Creek, Nebraska - of the second part, witnesseth. That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve Thousand \$12,000 Dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged to be there presents grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, alien and confirm unto the said party of the second part, and to her heirs and assigns forever, all that certain piece or parcel of land situate and being in the town of Cherry Creek, County of Buffalo and State of Nebraska and described as follows, to wit: The North half of the South Northeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4} \text{ of } \frac{1}{4}$) of Section numbered thirty two (32) in Township numbered twelve (12) of Range numbered thirteen (13) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, containing eighty (80) acres according to the Government survey.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining. To have and to hold the said premises as above described, with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part and to her heirs and assigns forever. And the said Conrad Bruckner and Anna, his wife party of the first part, their heirs, executors and administrators doth covenant grant, bargain, and agree to and with the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns, that at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents are well well seized of the above granted premises in fee simple, that they are free from all incumbrances whatever and that they will and their heirs, executors, & administrators forever shall warrant and defend the same against all lawful claims whatsoever.
