And in case of the failure of the said party of the second part to make either of the payments, or perform any of the covenants in this part herby made and entered into, this contract shall, at the option of the party of the first part, be forfeited and determined, and the party of the second part shall forfeit all payments made by him on this contract, and such payments shall be retained by the said parties of the first part in full satisfaction and liquidation of all damages by them sustained, and they shall have the right to re-enter and take possession of the premises aforesaid. It is mutually agreed that all the covenants and agreements herein contained shall extend to and be obligatory upon the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of the respective parties.

The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office of Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that pursuant to the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874, and June 14, 1878 "to encourage the growth of timber on the western prairies" the claim of Kate M. Bean, formerly Kate M. Todd, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South East quarter of Section twenty-eight in Township eleven North, of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plan of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Kate M. Bean the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto, unto the said Kate M. Bean and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
