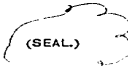

Meissner has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

South half of the South west quarter of Section Twenty-four in Township Ten north, of Range, Twentieth west, in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said George H. Meissner the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George H. Meissner and to his heirs and assigns forever.

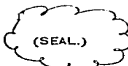
