Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto; the claim of William B. Beaver has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North half of the North West quarter of Section nineteen in Township twelve North of Range seventeen West and the East half of the North East quarter of Section twenty four in Township twelve North of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said William B. Beaver the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William B. Beaver and to his heirs and assigns forever.

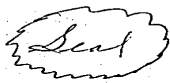
