Do all to whom these presents shall come granting:  
Certificate No 2507 Whereas Minnie Bentley of Buffalo County Nebraska has  
deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the  
Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears  
that full payment has been made by the said Minnie Bentley  
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 21<sup>st</sup> of April 1850  
entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public lands  
and the acts supplemental thereto for the west half of the South West  
quarter of section three and the North half of the South East  
quarter of section four in township twelve North of Range eighteen  
West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing  
One Hundred and fifty acs. according to the official plat  
of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office  
by the surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the  
said Minnie Bentley now known as the Church United States of America  
in execution of the promise and in conformity with the several  
Acts of Congress in such case made and provided having given and  
granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said  
Minnie Bentley and her heirs the said tract above described: do  
have and to hold the same together with all the rights  
privileges immunities and appurtenances of what so ever nature  
thereunto belonging unto the said Minnie Bentley and to her  
heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I Grover Cleveland  
President of the United States of America have caused these letters  
to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be  
hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of  
Washington the second day of December in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven and of the  
independence of the United States the one hundred and  
twelfth
