Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States

a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, where-

by it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862,

To secure homesteads to actual settlers in the public domain, and the acts

supplemental thereto, the claim of Louis A. Bever, Lettie Bever and Bellarie

Bever, minor orphan children of Lydia P. Bever deceased, has been established

and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the East half of the

South West quarter of Section twelve, including the North of Range sixteen

West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing eighty acres

according to the official plan of the survey of the said land returned to the

General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye, that there is

therefore granted by the United States unto the said Louis A. Bever, Lettie Bever

and Bellarie Bever the tract of land above described: To have and to hold

the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereto, unto the said Louis

A. Bever, Lettie Bever and Bellarie Bever and their heirs and assigns

forever.
