 To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting. Whereas there  
 has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a  
 Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska  
 whereby it appears that pursuant to the acts of Congress Approved  
 March 3 1873 March 19 1874 and June 14 1878 To Encourage the growth  
 of timber on the Western Prairies the claim of the Heirs of Lydia P  
 Bever deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity  
 to law for the South-east Quarter of Section twelve in Township ten  
 north of Range six teen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in  
 Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the  
 Official Plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General Land  
 Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there is therefore  
 granted by the United States unto the said Heirs of Lydia P Bever deceased  
 the tract of Land above described to have and to hold the said tract of  
 Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Heirs of Lydia P Bever  
 deceased and to their heirs and assigns forever  
 In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the United  
 States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and  
 the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the eighth day  
 of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
 eighty nine and of the Independence of the United States the  
 one hundred and fourteenth.
