

Certificate No 1442.

The United States of America, To all whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas William N. Beyer of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William N. Beyer to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South West quarter of the North West quarter, the North half of the South West quarter, and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section four in Township twelve north, of range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William N. Beyer.

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the promises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William N. Beyer and to his heirs, the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said William N. Beyer and to his heirs and assigns forever.



Given under my hands, at the city of Washington the twenty fifth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty four, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.
