For all to whom these presents shall come greeting:
Whereas, Vienna S. Blackburn of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited
in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register
of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears
that full payment has been made by the said Vienna S. Blackburn
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820,
entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands"
and the acts supplemental thereto, for the lot numbered one of Section
twenty, and the lots numbered one and two of Section twenty-one
in Township eight North, of Range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal
Meridian in Nebraska, containing seventy-three acres and twenty
hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of
the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Sur-
veyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said
Vienna S. Blackburn. Now know ye, that the United States of
America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with
the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have
given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto
the said Vienna S. Blackburn and to her heirs the said tract above
described; To have and to hold the same together with all the rights
privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature
therunto belonging, unto the said Vienna S. Blackburn and
to her heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the
United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent
and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
Given under my hand at the city of Washington the sixteenth
day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and ninety-two, and of the Independence of the United States the
one hundred and sixteenth:
