To all to whom these presents shall come greeting,
 Certificate } Whereas Elam Bodman of Buffalo County Nebraska
 No 3698 } has deposited in the General Land office of the
 United States a certificate of the Register of the Land office at
 Lincoln Nebraska whereby it appears that Full payment has
 been made by the said Elam Bodman according to the provisions
 of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820 entitled "an act
 making further provision for the sale of the public Lands,"
 and the acts supplemental thereto for the Lots Numbered eight
 nine ten and eleven of Section eight; the Lots Numbered five and
 six of Section nine and the Lot Numbered One of Section seven
 ten in Township eight-North of Range fifteen West of the sixth
 principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and
 forty four acres and sixty hundredths of an acre
 according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned
 to the General Land office by the Surveyor General which said tract
 has been purchased by the said Elam Bodman.

Now Know ye that the United States of America in consideration of
 the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in
 such case made and provided have given and granted and by these
 presents do give and grant unto the said Elam Bodman and to
 his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold the
 same together with the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances
 of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Elam
 Bodman and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof I William Mc Kinley President of the
 United States of America have caused these letters to be made
 Patent and the seal of the General Land office to be hereunto
 affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the
 fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and ninety seven and of the Independence of the United States
 the one hundred and twenty first
