The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," there has been deposited in the General Land Office, Warrant No: 46000, for 160 acres, in favor of Guba Ross, Kentuckian, Captain Brayton's Company, Connecticut Militia, Mar 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South East quarter of Section two, in Township nine North, of Range fourteen West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, the said Warrant having been duly assigned to Jacob Booth, in whose favor said tract has been located.

Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Jacob Booth as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tract of Land above described: To Have and To Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Jacob Booth, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
