Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "to secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Addison Johnson has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

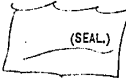
lots numbered One and Two, and the South half of the North East quarter of Section five, in Township eight North of Range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and fifty eight acres and eighty three hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Addison Johnson the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Addison Johnson and to his heirs and assigns forever.

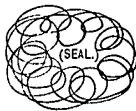
