To all to whom these presents shall come greeting
Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the
United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand
Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Acts of
Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878
"To encourage the growth of timber on the Western Prairies" the claim
of John H Borders has been established and duly consummated in conformity
to law for the lots numbered three and four and the East half of the
South West quarter of section eighteen in Township two North of
Range fifteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska
containing one hundred and sixty three acres and thirty hundredths of
an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land
returned to the General Land Office by the Survey of General

Now know ye that there is therefore granted by the United States
unto the said John H Borders the tract of land above described to have
and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto unto
the said John H Borders and to his heirs and assigns forever.

and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
