The United States of America, to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:
Whereas, Edward T. Bowers of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edward T. Bowers, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," and acts supplemental thereto, for the West Half of the North East quarter and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section seven, in Township North North, of Range sixteen West, of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and twenty acres, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edward T. Bowers. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Edward T. Bowers and to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Edward T. Bowers and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
