To all whom these Presents shall come greeting:

Whereas, In Pursuance of the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1838, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States there has been deposited in the General Land Office, No. 79 & 88 for 160 acres, in favor of Ellen G. Davis, and James M. Davis minor children of Thomas Davis, deceased, Private, Captain Henry's Company, Georgia Militia, War 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South West quarter of Section Fourteen, in Township Nine, North of Range Fourteen, West, in the District of lands subject to sale at Omaha, Nebraska containing One Hundred and Sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General the said Warrant having been assigned by Joseph Reagan, Guardian of the said James M. Davis (an insane person) by order of the Court of Ordinary Newton County, Georgia, and by Ellen G. McCord formerly the said Ellen G. Davis and her husband James M. McCord, to William H. Furley, and by him to Joseph Boyd, in whose favor said Tract has been located.

Now Knowye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Joseph Boyd, as assignee, of aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Andrew Johnson President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the seal of the general land office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the Tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven and of the Independence of the United States the Ninety second.
