The United States of America. Be it to whom these presents shall come, Greeting;  
Whereas in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, entitled, "An Act donating Public Lands to the several States and Territories which may provide Colleges for the Benefit of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts" there has been deposited in the General Land Office, Scrip No 288 for one quarter section of Land, in favor of the State of Florida, duly assigned by the proper authority of the said State to John W. Bradley, with evidence that the same has been located upon the east half of the South West Quarter, and the north half of the South East Quarter of Section six in Township Eight North of Range fifteen west, in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing one hundred and fifty eight acres and two hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General; Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John W. Bradley, or assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs the tract of Land above described: to have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John W. Bradley, as assignee as aforesaid, and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four, and of the independence of the United States the ninety eighth.
