ten in Township one north of Range sixteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Willard Broat the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Willard Broat and to his heirs and assigns forever.
