 To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:
 Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land
 Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land
 Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that
 pursuant to the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1873
 March 13, 1874 Ed June 14, 1878. "To encourage the growth
 of Timber on the Western Prairies" the claim of Willard
 Broar has been established and duly consummated in con-
 formity to law for the North half of the South West quarter
 of section Ten in Township Nine North of Range Seventeen
 West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska con-
 taining Eighty Acres according to the Official Plot of the
 survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office
 by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, That there is
 therefore granted by the United States unto the said Willard
 Broar the tract of Land above described, To have and to hold
 the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto unto the
 said Willard Broar and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I Benjamin Harrison President
 of the United States of America have caused these letters to be
 made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be
 hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of
 Washington the first day of April in the year of our Lord
 One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety, and of the Indepen-
 dence of the United States the One Hundred and Fourteenth,
