To all to whom these presents shall come greeting,
 Where-as George S. Broughton of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, which by it appears that full payment has been made by the said George S. Broughton according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "an act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South half of the North West Quarter of Section Thirty Two, in Township Nine, North of Range Seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing eighty acres according to the official Plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said George S. Broughton.

Now know ye that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said George S. Broughton, and to his heirs, the said tract above described, so have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said George S. Broughton and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the tenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, and in the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixth.
