The United States of America. To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Certificate No. 2034.
Whereas Erasmus Brown of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Erasmus Brown to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th. of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the lot numbered five of Section four, and the lots numbered five, six, seven & eight of Section five, in Township eight, North of Range fourteen, west of the sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska containing one hundred & twenty four acres, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Erasmus Brown, now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made & provided have given & granted, and by these presents do give & grant, unto the said Erasmus Brown & to his heirs the said tract above described: To have & to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities & appurtenances, of whatever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Erasmus Brown and to his heirs & assigns forever.
In Testimony whereof, J. Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the eleventh day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eighty four and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.
