

Certificate No 1347. The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.  
 Whereas John J. Brown of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited  
 in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the  
 Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby  
 it appears that full payment has been made by the said  
 John J. Brown according to the provisions of an Act of Congress  
 on the 24<sup>th</sup> of April 1850, entitled "an act making further provisions  
 for the sale of the Public Lands", and the acts supplemental thereto  
 for the South West quarter of Section thirty six in Township  
 Nine North, of range thirteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian  
 in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according  
 to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to  
 the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said  
 tract has been purchased by the said John J. Brown.  
 Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration  
 of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress  
 in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and  
 by these presents do give and grant, unto the said John J. Brown  
 and to his heirs, the said tract above described.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights,  
 privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever na-  
 ture, therunto belonging, unto the said John J. Brown and to  
 his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I Chester A. Arthur, President of the  
 United States of America, have caused these letters to be made  
 Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed,  
 Given under my hand at the City of Washington the sixth  
 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-  
 dred and eighty one, and of the Independence of the United States  
 the one hundred and sixth.
